Trails

Trail Maintenance - Higgins St. entrance

• Need to look at further funding applications

- applied for CBT community initiative for \$8,500.
- April City Council meeting, Rob McInnis will speak to the proposal for the Higgins Street entrance to the park.
- Kent will look for other funding opportunities
- Work will go 250m up from the gate at the Higgins St. entrance
- Applied to the Water Management Branch for permission to do the work. Naomi suggested City planner Troy Pollock may be helpful.
- Suggestion to build up lower spots further along Eimer's Road when truck is there.

Long term maintenance plan - working with other trails societies

- KTS (Kimberley Trails Society) would like to work together, trying to streamline things
- Label trails on a master plan with a colour in regards to sensitivity to impact
- Streamline the trail maintenance standards
- Designate one contact person in the community for event organizers

Trail Manager

- Have one point person for event organizers to communicate with
- Making it simpler for the event organizers
- Create a job for a trail manager high level position
- Someone who understands the process, organizes work parties, trail maintenance, prioritization and signage on behalf of all the trail groups in town.
- Develop specs for jobs then possibly seek funding from the City of Kimberley
- Improve public awareness and ownership of trails by volunteering or donating cash
- Apply for funding for this position, grant applications

Memorial Benches

- Bench at Keiver way donated by Kiever family is approved
- Tyee bench, just like the one at Eimers lake, they are designed to be able to be knocked down and packed in to remote locations.
- We have two other requests for benches, one in the park
- We have no written policy on benches, currently we approve the location, design and installation at the KNPS meetings.
- Benches in lookout locations

- Proposed copy circulated is 10 pages
- Will include write up about the guided snow shoe walk
